GENERAL PART OF THE CALL

This call aims to inform prospective degree seeking students about the University of Rijeka's study programmes taught in English. It outlines the entry requirements, conditions and deadlines for application and enrolment in the 1st year of undergraduate, integrated (undergraduate and graduate), and graduate programmes for the 2026/2027 academic year.

By applying to this call, applicants acknowledge that the University of Rijeka and its faculties, as data controllers, will process their personal data solely for the purpose of organizing the selection process (including identification, competition registration, data verification, decision-making, re-registration, and publication of results). Applicants are also informed that their personal data will not be processed for any purpose other than those stated above and in compliance with relevant European and national data protection laws.

BASIC INFORMATION ON THE PROGRAMMES

The University of Rijeka and its faculties offer the following programmes taught in English in the 2026/2027 academic year:

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS AND SELECTION

Study programmes taught in English are open to Croatian and international candidates.

UNDERGRADUATE AND INTEGRATED (UNDEGRADUATE AND GRADUATE) PROGRAMMES

Entry requirement: at least four-year high school education or its equivalent.

Applicants who completed their high school education in Croatia are required to take the state graduation exam. Applicants who completed their high school education abroad are generally not required to take it. However, some faculties may set minimum score requirements, including state graduation exam results, for certain programmes. In such cases, applicants can either take the required state graduation exams (in Croatian) or choose to be assessed based on their high school grades, special achievements, and any additional tests. Final exam results, if part of a high school education abroad, are considered equivalent to the Croatian state graduation exam.

Some degree programmes may have additional requirements, such as specific high school subjects, additional assessments, or demonstration of psychophysiological abilities relevant to the field of study. Those, as well as English language requirements, are outlined in the SPECIFIC PART of this Call and/or on the faculty websites.

GRADUATE PROGRAMMES

Entry requirement: a degree at the undergraduate or integrated level or higher. In some cases, applicants with a vocational undergraduate degree may enrol after passing additional exams set by the faculty.

Some faculties may have specific admission requirements for certain graduate programmes, due to their specialized nature. These requirements may include completing a relevant undergraduate degree, a suitable lifelong learning programme, a specific number of ECTS credits, or other academic qualifications. Additionally, some faculties may require assessments of knowledge, skills, and competencies to ensure candidates are adequately prepared for successful study.

The specific enrolment and English language requirements for each graduate programme are outlined in the SPECIFIC PART of this Call and/or on the faculty websites.

REGISTRATION AND APPLICATION

Applicants for enrolment to studies offered by the University of Rijeka must submit their applications through the relevant national application system, applicable to both Croatian and international applicants.

In certain cases, the application process is conducted at the faculty level in parallel with the national system, with distinct deadlines for submission, to ensure the timely determination of a candidate's eligibility for admission to the selected study programme.

Applicants are therefore strongly advised to carefully review the guidelines for each programme outlined in the SPECIFIC PART of this Call.

Additionally, some faculties provide support and guidance for registration in the national application systems.

Details about the application and registration procedures to the national application systems is described below and in the SPECIFIC PART of the Call and/or faculty's websites.

UNDERGRADUATE AND INTEGRATED (UNDEGRADUATE AND GRADUATE) PROGRAMMES

For undergraduate and integrated study programmes, applicants must apply through the National Information System for Application to Higher Education Institutions (NISaHEI/NISpVU) at www.postani-student.hr. This system enables applicants to register for the state graduation exam in Croatia and apply for their preferred programmes. Registration is carried out at the following [link](#).

After completing the registration, applicants will receive a username, password, PIN, and TAN via SMS. These credentials are required to access the “[Postani student](#)” system, where they can select the faculty and the study programme they wish to enrol in under *Moj odabir* (My choice).

Applicants may apply to up to 10 study programmes. It is essential to list the preferred study programme as the top priority. Priority choices can be modified until the deadline indicated in the Calendar section at <https://www.studij.hr/kalendar>. Please note that there are separate calendars: one for undergraduate and integrated studies, and another for graduate studies.

The system enables applicants for undergraduate and integrated studies to submit the **Request of a foreign high school educational qualification** (the final day for submitting the request is 1 July 2026). The request will appear in the applicants' personal profile. The decision on the recognition of a foreign secondary education qualification will be delivered directly by the Agency for Science and Higher Education to the higher education institution for the purpose of enrolment.

The final deadline for registering for study programmes through the national application system is 15 July 2026 at 1:59 p.m.

GRADUATE PROGRAMMES

Faculties offering graduate study programmes manage their own application processes independently of the national system. We strongly recommend carefully reviewing the instructions and deadlines for the desired programme in the SPECIFIC PART of this Call.

PROCEDURE FOR THE RECOGNITION OF FOREIGN HIGHER EDUCATION QUALIFICATIONS

Recognition of prior educational qualifications for candidates who completed their high school education or undergraduate studies abroad, for the purpose of continuing education at Croatian higher education institutions, is an integral part of the enrolment procedure.

UNDERGRADUATE AND INTEGRATED (UNDEGRADUATE AND GRADUATE) PROGRAMMES

Applicants to undergraduate and integrated study programmes who hold a foreign secondary school qualification submit a request for recognition of their educational qualification along with the necessary documents for the application procedure to the [Agency for Science and Higher Education](#). Detailed instructions, request forms and a list of supporting documents are available at <https://www.studij.hr/recognition>.

To initiate the recognition process, candidates must submit a Request for Recognition. This request can be submitted as soon as the candidate has registered on the website www.postani-student.hr.

Candidates are advised to carefully follow the application steps outlined in the SPECIFIC PART of this Call to ensure timely submission of the Request for Recognition.

GRADUATE PROGRAMMES

Prospective students who completed their undergraduate studies abroad must undergo a recognition process for their foreign higher education qualifications.

The procedure is managed by the [Academic Recognition Qualifications Office](#) of the University of Rijeka to which candidates must submit the Request for Recognition along with the required documents. The Request is submitted using the prescribed form available [HERE](#) (also found under the "Documents" section at <https://uniri.hr/en/studies/academic-recognition-of-foreign-higher-education-qualifications-office/>).

The completed application form with all necessary documentation in PDF format should be sent by e-mail to: recognition@uniri.hr.

Note: The Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences (for the Master's in Cognitive Sciences - Cognition and the Mind) will collect the required documentation from candidates as part of their application and selection procedures. They will then submit the Request for Recognition to the Academic Recognition Qualifications Office on behalf of the candidates.

The processing fee for academic recognition of foreign higher education qualifications is **€60**. Payment method is outlined [HERE](#).

ENROLMENT

Enrolment in study programmes is managed by the respective faculties. Accepted candidates will enrol according to the procedures outlined in the SPECIFIC PART of this Call.

Important note: Accepted international candidates, whether through faculty admission or assigned an enrolment number in the national system (if applicable), must apply for a Croatian Personal Identification Number (PIN/OIB): [link](#). Some faculties provide assistance in obtaining the PIN.

UNDERGRADUATE AND INTEGRATED (UNDEGRADUATE AND GRADUATE) PROGRAMMES

While some faculties select candidates through internal application processes, **all candidates for enrolment to undergraduate and integrated studies will also be ranked in the national application system**, granting them the right to enrol in the programme. **Each candidate will appear on the ranking list** in the national application system **only for the programme at the top of their priority list** and will be assigned an enrolment number. The candidate will be removed from the ranking lists of any other programmes.

Once assigned an enrolment number for a specific programme, candidates are required to enrol in that programme. Failure to do so may result in the higher education institution charging opportunity costs for the unfilled study place, potentially amounting to two-thirds of the year's tuition fee. To avoid such charges, **candidates must withdraw from any study programmes in the national application system they no longer intend to pursue, before the final rankings are published**.

Additionally, candidates should be aware that study programmes regulate their own payment policies, including amounts, deadlines, and non-refundable fees. Candidates are strongly advised to carefully review these regulations in the SPECIFIC PART of this Call to prevent any confusion or issues.

The ranking list in the national application system for undergraduate and integrated programmes will be published at <https://www.postani-student.hr/Ucenici/Prijava.aspx>.

Candidates ranked within the quota who receive an enrolment number on the final ranking list are eligible to enrol in their respective study programmes. Once the final ranking list is published, no further changes are possible. Therefore, candidates must regularly monitor their scores and notifications on www.postani-student.hr.

Details regarding the enrolment process and deadlines are provided in the SPECIFIC PART of this Call. If candidates are selected through the internal application processes of the respective faculties, any relevant deadlines and responsibilities related to the centralised platform will be communicated by the faculty.

GRADUATE PROGRAMMES

The enrolment process and deadlines for graduate study programmes are provided in the SPECIFIC PART of this Call.

TUTITION FEE AND OTHER COSTS

The tuition fee for each specific programme is detailed in the SPECIFIC PART of the Call. Candidates are responsible for covering all additional costs associated with the application and enrolment process for a particular degree programme. These may include fees for additional examinations, student insurance, and other related expenses. Payments must be made following the procedures and within the deadlines outlined in the SPECIFIC PART of the Call.

All students are required to pay an enrolment fee, which will be finalized prior to enrolment and is estimated to be approximately 60 euros.

SPECIFIC PART OF THE CALL

The SPECIFIC PART of this Call provides detailed information on the conditions, deadlines for pre-application and application, the enrolment process, required documents for enrolment, tuition fees (including payment schedules), additional costs, entrance exams (including their organization and deadlines), and other important details related to specific study programmes.

Candidates are strongly encouraged to regularly check the websites of the faculties they wish to enrol in, as these sites provide more detailed information on enrolment requirements.

University undergraduate study Business economics module: INTERNATIONAL BUSSINES

Undergraduate study programs last for three years – six semesters, and upon the completion of the program, students receive the academic title Bachelor in Economics, univ. bacc. oec.

Entry requirement: completed 4-year high school education programme or its equivalent. An IELTS 6.0 English proficiency level or CEFRL B2 level is recommended.

Application process:

STEP 1

- First inform yourself about your application eligibility and costs (fees, deposits, health insurance costs, accommodation and subsistence costs, etc.) at international@efri.uniri.hr
- If eligible and ready to apply, proceed with Step 2.

STEP 2

- Online registration/application through the Central Application Office (<https://www.postani-student.hr/Ucenici/RegistracijaK.aspx>). The application platform opens in February for the next academic year which starts in October.
- After logging in be sure you have selected our English-taught undergraduate study program with 180 ECTS, under the section "Moj Odabir".

STEP 3

- Sending original application documents to the Central Application Office (application deadline: end June), including the Request for recognition of your high school diploma. Please refer to:

University graduate study Business economics module: INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS

Graduate study programs last two years – four semesters, and upon the completion of the program, students receive the academic title Master in Economics, univ. mag. oec.

Entry requirement: Academic undergraduate degree (BA/BSc) in the field of Economics or Business Economics (at least 180 ECTS credits). An English proficiency level IELTS 6.0 is recommended as a minimum. The grading procedure includes the evaluation of the success achieved at the university undergraduate study programme, i. e. the Distinction Programme:

- weighted average grade calculated to three decimal places
- if several candidates achieve the same weighted average grade, then preference will be given to the candidate who achieved a higher cumulative grade in the subjects: Microeconomics and Macroeconomics.

The grading threshold is determined by the enrolment quota.

The results of the grading procedure will be published in September after the completion of the application process on the Faculty's website www.efri.uniri.hr.

Application process:

First inform yourself about your application eligibility and costs (fees, deposits, health insurance costs, accommodation and subsistence costs etc.) at international@efri.uniri.hr.

If eligible and ready to apply, submit your foreign bachelor diploma for **recognition** to the [Academic Recognition Qualifications Office](#) of the University of Rijeka (latest May/June).

Admission procedure: Applications for the admission procedure will be accepted until mid-September 2026, in accordance with the information published on the Faculty's website. Applications must be submitted by the specified deadline. Candidates must attach the documents listed in the Information on the Admission Procedure and Enrollment of Students in the First Year of Graduate Studies in the Academic Year 2026/2027 published on www.efri.uniri.hr.

Enrolments after the 1st grading procedure will be held at the end of September 2026, according to the published schedule. After the ranking list is published, the enrolment schedule will be published on the Faculty of Economics website www.efri.uniri.hr. Registration documents - certificate of residence (for full-time students coming from outside PGŽ) - a 4 x 6 photo - payment slip confirming the payment of enrolment costs and school fees. The exact dates for enrolment and all details will be published on the Faculty's [website](#).

Please note that in accordance with the decision of the University Senate, a standard enrolment fee is changed for each academic year.

Lectures start in October

Application process is similar for both EU and non-EU citizens. The only difference is in the receiving quota. EU citizens applying for full-time studying in Croatia are treated under same regulations as Croatian students, meaning they have the same rights and obligations.

Non-EU citizens are applying within the receiving quota for non-EU students and are obliged to full tuition for non-EU students.

University graduate study DISCRETE MATHEMATICS AND ITS APPLICATIONS

Discrete Mathematics and its Applications is a 2-year graduate/master's degree university programme leading to the academic title Master of Science in Mathematics. Detailed information about the study programme can be found on the official [website](#) of the Faculty of Mathematics, University of Rijeka.

The academic year starts in October 2026 and admission is only possible into the winter semester.

The maximum number of students admitted in the academic year 2026/2027 is 10.

Admission requirements: Applicants who hold a Bachelor's degree in Mathematics or equivalent are eligible to apply.

Admission procedure: Applications should sent by e-mail to math@math.uniri.hr or by post to the following address: Faculty of Mathematics, University of Rijeka, Radmilo Matejčić 2, 51000 Rijeka, Croatia. Applications must be submitted by midnight on 7 May 2026. Incomplete and late applications will not be considered.

The detailed application requirements, the number of places available, the application procedure, the list of documents and the enrolment information are published on the Faculty website and form an integral part of this call for applications. Students from countries outside the European Union should contact their local Croatian Embassy as soon as possible to find out whether they need a visa to enter and study in the Republic of Croatia.

The final score and ranking: The final score is composed of the grade points achieved for the relevant degree completed (95%) and the grade points for categorised athlete status (5%). All applicants will be informed of the results of their applications no later than 20 May 2026. The results will also be published on the official website of the Faculty. The deadline for appeals is 72 hours after the announcement of the results.

If places are still available after the first application cycle, applications for the second cycle must be submitted in person or by email by midnight on 27 August 2026. Incomplete and late applications will not be considered. All applicants will be informed of the results of their applications no later than 2 September 2026. The results will also be published on the official website of the Faculty. The deadline for appeals is 72 hours after the announcement of the results.

Enrolment: Enrolment will take place at the end of September 2026, at the University of Rijeka, Faculty of Mathematics, Radmilo Matejčić 2, 51000 Rijeka, after the final ranking list has been published. Applicants who are ranked within the quota and have received an enrolment number are eligible to enrol on the programme. The exact dates for enrolment and all details will be published on the Faculty's [website](#).

Please note that in accordance with the decision of the University Senate, a standard enrolment fee is charged for each academic year.

Enrolment is only valid for one academic year at a time.

Tuition fees: The tuition fee for admitted students is **€4000** per academic year. Tuition fee is paid in full at enrolment.

University undergraduate study Business Economics in Tourism and Hospitality module: HOSPITALITY MANAGEMENT

1. Entry requirements

- Candidate who has completed a relevant secondary education program lasting at least four years and have passed the Croatian State Matura exam.
- Candidate who completed a relevant secondary education program lasting at least four years in the Republic of Croatia before 2010, without the requirement of passing the Croatian State "Matura" exam.
- Candidate who has completed an equivalent education abroad.

2. Prerequisite for Enrolment – Motivational Interview

The motivational interview in English language is a mandatory part of the selection process. The committee evaluates the applicants based on the interview. The motivational interview is an onsite or online discussion regarding the candidates' motivations and interest in the field of business economics in tourism and hospitality, with a special emphasis on hotel management. This may include professional goals, attitudes towards a specific area, or the desire for personal development of each candidate.

Depending on the outcome of the motivational interview, candidates who meet the requirements will be ranked on the official list for enrolment in the study program.

3. For enrolment in the first year of study, the following criteria are evaluated:

1. **Success achieved during secondary school** – up to 40%
2. **Success achieved on the Croatian State Matura exam** – up to 60%, including:
 - Croatian language – up to 20%
 - Mathematics – up to 20% (Level B)
 - Foreign language – up to 20% (Level B)
3. **State competitions** – 5%
4. **Categorized athlete (categories 1-6)** – 5%
5. **Other special achievements** – 5%

The entry of results under numbers 1, 2, 3, and 4 into the NISpVU system (National Information System for Applications to Higher Education) is organized by the Central Admissions Office.

4. **State competitions in all disciplines are evaluated for enrolment in the first year of study.**
5. **The Faculty of Tourism and Hospitality Management evaluates other special achievements during the selection process, allowing candidates to earn additional points as follows:**
 1. **Knowledge of a second foreign language** has evaluated if the candidate studied it for at least three years in secondary school or at a language school (minimum level A2). The following foreign languages are assessed: English, German, French, and Italian – 5%.
 2. **Completion of another four-year secondary school** – 5%.
 3. **International competitions** in the fields of economics, tourism, and hospitality – 5%.

Data regarding additional points from other special achievements assessed by the Faculty of Tourism and Hospitality Management are entered into the system by the Coordinator for the National Information System for Applications to the Faculty.

Tuition fees

The annual tuition fee for Croatian students and students from the EU: **€2000**.

The annual tuition fee for non-EU students: **€3000**.

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Joint professional graduate study MASTER OF SUSTAINABLE OUTDOOR HOSPITALITY MANAGEMENT

The first European joint professional graduate study, in the field of tourism and hospitality innovations specialised in sustainable outdoor hospitality management, combining theory and practise, offered at universities in the Netherlands (Breda University of Applied Sciences, BUAs), Croatia (University of Rijeka, Faculty of Tourism and Hospitality Management), and Spain (University of Girona, UdG).

Applications for the first European joint professional graduate study Master of Sustainable Outdoor Hospitality Management programme are open until 15 June for applicants from non-EU countries and 15 August for EU students. Applicants are expected to be motivated, have 180 ECTS credits from a bachelor's degree and a good knowledge of the English language.

All students interested in financial support should send a motivation letter to scholarships@buas.nl and mention the name Master SOHM in the request.

All students have the opportunity to receive a scholarship, and for all of them there is a guarantee of a supervised internship in the best European camps or an internship in the camping industry.

Admission to the **Master of Sustainable Outdoor Hospitality Management, Joint professional graduate study** is allowed to students:

- who hold a Bachelor's degree (BA, BSc., BBA, B Com), for example in Tourism, Hospitality Management, International Business, Management, Economics, Law, E-commerce, Urban Development, Geography, Social Sciences or Finance,
- who have completed undergraduate studies in the field of economics,
- acquired at least 180 ECTS.

University graduate study COGNITIVE SCIENCES – COGNITION AND THE MIND

Study programme

The Division of Cognitive Sciences at the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, University of Rijeka is inviting applications to the graduate/Masters University study programme *Cognitive Sciences: Cognition and the Mind*. This is an interdisciplinary, research-focused 2-year MSc programme in cognitive sciences with a unique integration of psychology and philosophy, complemented by other disciplines within cognitive sciences. The programme is conducted entirely in English.

Admission will be for the winter semester, which starts in October 2026. The annual tuition fee for this programme is **€1200** (both for EU and non-EU citizens). Three quarters of the first-year tuition fee, **€900** (non-refundable) needs to be paid upon receipt of a Conditional Offer of Admission letter to secure a place on the programme. The full annual tuition fee needs to be paid and received by the Finance Office of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences by the date of submitting documentation for enrolment into the programme. Scholarships for this programme are available as advertised on our official website <https://cogsci.uniri.hr/>.

Applicants with an undergraduate University degree (or another degree that qualifies you to apply for a graduate programme – this can be an integrated University degree, or another University graduate degree) in cognitive sciences or one of the cognitive science disciplines, including psychology, philosophy, linguistics, informatics, biology, biomedicine, and anthropology, are eligible to apply. Applicants with a University degree in another discipline are also eligible to apply and are encouraged to contact the Selection Committee at cogsci@uniri.hr or the Head of Studies at lj.ostojic@uniri.hr early to discuss their eligibility. The Selection Committee will consider eligibility of candidates who have a degree in another discipline on an individual basis.

Applicants who are in the last year of their undergraduate programme can apply. If successful, in the Conditional Offer of Admission, one of the conditions will be that they need proof of a completed undergraduate degree as well as proof of academic recognition of their undergraduate degree latest by the time of submitting documents for enrolment in the Masters programme.

Applications

The **Standard application deadline is Friday, 6 March 2026**. We strongly encourage all candidates who are non-EU citizens and need an entry visa into Croatia to apply by this deadline [note that non-EU citizens who already have residency in another EU country do not require an entry visa for Croatia]. The process of obtaining a visa can take a long time and it is important that you start the process early.

If places remain, there will be a Late application deadline on Friday, 15 May 2026, and an Exceptional application deadline on Friday, 21 August 2026, may be opened if places remain. Applicants applying at the Exceptional Deadline are advised to complete the academic recognition process before applying OR to submit all documentation needed for the academic recognition, as detailed in the Application Form at the time of applying to the study programme.

Only applications submitted in this way will be considered. Applicants from any country and of any citizenship may apply.

The selection process has two stages. In the first stage, we will shortlist candidates based on their academic performance and motivational letter and will contact all applicants within two weeks after the application deadline. Shortlisted candidates will be invited to a short interview. In the second stage, shortlisted candidates will meet with three of our teaching staff online for a short interview through a digital platform. The aim of the interview is to assess proficiency of English and fit for the programme. The interview will involve three questions. The first question will relate to the applicant's motivation for the programme, the second question will be based around the applicant's research proposal that they will have submitted as part of the Structured Motivation Letter, and the third question will be a short question about research methods in cognitive sciences. Candidates may find it useful to look through the suggested literature on <https://cogsci.uniri.hr/admissions> as preparation for the interview.

Please note that we do not require any official English proficiency exams. There are no costs for the application and selection process to this programme!

The final decision will be made within 14 days after the first interview dates and will be published on the official Faculty webpage. We will also email all candidates. The appeal period is 24 hours after the results are announced.

We are looking to admit up to 14 students in the academic year 2026/2027.

Academic Recognition for Foreign Degrees

Academic recognition of Higher Education degrees for further study at the University of Rijeka are conducted by the Academic Recognition Qualifications Office of the University of Rijeka. Enrolment schedule

Submission of documents for enrolment for successful candidates is on 24 and 25 September 2026 at the University of Rijeka, Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, Sveučilišna avenija 4, 51000 Rijeka. All candidates must enrol in person. Enrolment is only valid for one year at a time. There is a standard enrolment fee for each academic year, approximately €50-60. Once this has been set by the University of Rijeka for the academic year 2026/2027, all applicants will be informed of it.

Students from countries outside the European Union should contact their local Croatian Embassy as soon as possible to confirm whether they need a visa to travel to and study in the Republic of Croatia and what documentation they need to send for the visa application. Please note that students coming from countries that require full legislation of their documents should start this process early.

University Integrated Undergraduate and Graduate Study of MEDICINE

Medical Studies in English language is a university integrated undergraduate and graduate study programme with a 6-year duration (360 ECTS). The maximum number of admitted students is 50, and all the admitted students are expected to pay the tuition fee in the amount of **€12000** per academic year (€200 per 1 ECTS). The cost of the application for the entrance exam is **€200**. The academic year starts in October, and admission is possible only into the winter semester. The tuition fee must be paid in full at enrolment.

The cost of enrolment fee for the academic year 2026/2027 will be defined by the University of Rijeka (approximately €50-60).

Applicants who completed secondary school education, have taken the courses in Biology, Chemistry and Physics or related subjects for at least two years during secondary school education and passed the final graduation exam are eligible to apply.

Applications for Entrance Examination

Applications are received for spring and summer exam term until 9 working days prior to the exam term date and for autumn exam term until 5 working days prior to the exam term date. University integrated undergraduate and graduate study of DENTAL MEDICINE

Dental Medicine in English is University integrated undergraduate and graduate study, with a 6-year duration. The maximum number of admitted students will be 12.

- The tuition fee for admitted students costs **€12000** per academic year.

- The cost of the application fee is **€250**.

- The cost of enrolment fee for the academic year 2026/2027 should be approximately **€55-60**.

The academic year starts in October and admission is possible only into the winter semester. The tuition fee can be paid in full at enrolment or in two instalments (**€6000** at enrolment, **€6000** by November 15, 2026).

Entrance exam

The entrance exam consists of a test in Biology, Chemistry and Physics (120 multiple-choice questions, with 40 questions from each subject).

The overall minimum score is 30%.

Exemption from the entrance exam

- Applicants who have completed a premedical college or passed internationally recognized exams (MCAT – with a minimal score of 125 for each section) or earned a BA/Bsc degree in natural sciences with good credits in Biology, Physics, and Chemistry may be exempted from the entrance exam.
- Applicants who have taken the MediTest-EU (>70%) may also be exempted from the entrance exam.

Psychomotor Ability Test

Psychomotor Ability Test is used for determining the precision, coordination, control, dexterity and reaction time of candidates.

Psychomotor Ability Test will be held online on following dates:

YUFE's Joint Bachelor URBAN SUSTAINABILITY STUDIES

YUFE's Joint Bachelor in Urban Sustainability Studies, developed by the European university alliance YUFE (Young Universities for the Future of Europe), equips students with interdisciplinary expertise in urban sustainability and fosters the ability to address local, regional, and global challenges through diverse methodological and cultural perspectives. The programme is strongly mobility-oriented: students follow an open and flexible curriculum delivered across several

partner universities and complete at least two mandatory mobility periods, which are key to developing intercultural competencies and a comparative understanding of urban sustainability issues.

Graduates will receive a joint degree issued by seven European universities, positioning them as highly competitive candidates for professional careers and advanced academic opportunities.

This degree programme offers an open curriculum with an innovative approach to studying at selected partner universities and includes at least two mobility periods (semesters).

When applying for YUFE's Joint Bachelor in Urban Sustainability Studies, applicants begin by choosing one of the seven partner universities as their starting university, where they will spend most of their study period.

In this call, the term "applicant" refers to any person who submits an application and takes part in the admission process up to and including the selection phase. The term "candidate" is used only after an applicant has been selected for admission to the programme.

Key information

To be considered for admission, applicants must meet the following eligibility requirements:

- A secondary education degree
- A minimum B2 level of English

The maximum number of students admitted to the programme at the University of Rijeka (UNIRI) for the 2026/2027 academic year is 20.

The annual **tuition fee** for YUFE's Joint Bachelor at UNIRI is:

- **€2500** for EEA applicants, citizens of Ukraine granted temporary protection in the Republic of Croatia, and applicants from neighbouring countries in the Stabilization and Association Process (SAP): Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Montenegro, North Macedonia, Serbia, and Kosovo.
- **€5000** for non-EEA applicants.

The enrolment fee for the 2026/2027 academic year will be set by UNIRI and is expected to be approximately **€60**. Both the tuition fee and the enrolment fee must be paid annually for the duration of the programme.

Step 1: Application in the Virtual Campus

Applications for YUFE's Joint Bachelor must be submitted via the YUFE Virtual Campus: [YUFE Virtual Campus](#).

Applicants must upload required documents and complete a short motivation questionnaire.

1.1. Required Documents

Secondary education degree: A four-year high school diploma or equivalent, meeting university admission criteria in the country of graduation.

For applicants completing secondary education in 2026, a confirmation of study status should be provided.

Proof of English language proficiency:

Level B2 or higher on the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR), as stated in official educational records, or

A valid language certificate (issued within the past two years) with the following minimum scores:

TOEFL iBT (test centre only): 80

IELTS Academic: 6.5 overall, 6.0 per component

ITACE: B2

Cambridge English: B2 First (176 or above)

PTE Academic: 59

Alternative qualifications and equivalent scores may be considered.

Exemptions apply to those who:

- Hold a diploma from an English-taught programme in Australia, Canada (English-speaking), Ireland, New Zealand, the UK, or the US.
- Completed an English-taught programme elsewhere, with the language of instruction stated in official documents (English language proficiency of such applicants might be assessed through an interview).

Passport or Identity Card

A scanned copy of the relevant passport pages or an identity card (for EU citizens) is required.

1.2. Motivation Questionnaire

Applicants must complete a motivation questionnaire in the Virtual Campus, explaining their interest in the YUFE's Joint Bachelor programme. Responses help assess suitability for this flexible, multi-university study format and may be used as a selection criterion for specific starting universities if necessary.

The questionnaire covers topics such as adaptability to new cultures, collaborative problem-solving experience, goals for the programme, and academic and career aspirations. Each response should not exceed 700 characters.

1.3. Application deadlines

All required documents must be uploaded to the Virtual Campus by the respective deadlines:

- non-EEA applicants: 1 May 2026 (*Non-EU/EEA applicants are kindly advised to apply by 1 May due to the expected visa processing time.*)
- EEA applicants with a non-EEA degree: 1 June 2026
- EEA applicants with an EEA degree:
 - For enrolment in the summer term: 15 June 2026
 - For enrolment in the autumn term: 26 August 2026 (if there are seats still available)

Step 2: Eligibility assessment

After the application is submitted, eligibility for the programme will be assessed. This includes verifying whether the application form is complete, all required documents have been provided, and the admission eligibility requirements are met.

If the eligibility requirements are fulfilled, applicants will receive an eligibility notice via the YUFE Virtual Campus within 7 days following the document submission.

Receiving an eligibility notice does not indicate acceptance into the programme but confirms that the eligibility requirements have been met, allowing the admission process to proceed to the next steps, which may include selection.

Step 3: Recognition of Foreign High School Qualifications (if applicable)

For applicants who completed secondary education abroad, diploma recognition in Croatia is required. The Croatian Agency for Science and Higher Education oversees this process, and UNIRI will submit the request on behalf of candidates.

To proceed, additional forms and validated copies of required documents (high school report cards, graduation certificate/diploma, and proof of citizenship) must be sent by priority mail by, as soon as possible, after receiving eligibility notice.

All documents must be notarized, and non-EU applicants must provide certified translations into Croatian or English. Detailed instructions will be included in the admission notification.

Documents written in Latin script (e.g., certificates or transcripts) from applicants from Bosnia and Herzegovina, Montenegro, and Serbia do not require translation. However, for these documents to be accepted, they must be notarized by a public notary.

Important for non-EEA applicants: Due to the late enrolment period and the proximity of the semester start, participation in the second-round selection is not available for non-EEA applicants.

Step 4: Selection and admission

If the number of applicants exceeds the available capacity, a selection process will be conducted based on the evaluation of motivation questionnaire responses, following predefined guidelines to ensure fairness and transparency.

The selection process will take place within up to three admission rounds:

1. **First round (May)** - This admission round is **exclusively intended for non-EEA applicants**, due to the earlier deadlines required for visa processing, recognition procedures, and timely completion of enrolment. Maximum ten applicants will be selected in this round.
2. **Second round (June)** - Open to all applicants.
3. **Third round (August, optional)** - Organised only if seats are still available.

Eligible applicants who are not selected within the quota will be referred to another YUFE university listed as their second preferred starting university in the Virtual Campus.

Selected candidates will receive an admission notification via email.

Step 5: Enrolment

At the conclusion of the admission process, UNIRI will notify applicants via email regarding the outcome. The candidate must confirm their readiness to enrol at the University of Rijeka to begin the official enrolment process.

Enrolment will take place online on the following dates:

- First-round enrolment: 16-17 July 2026
- Second-round enrolment: 17-18 September 2026
